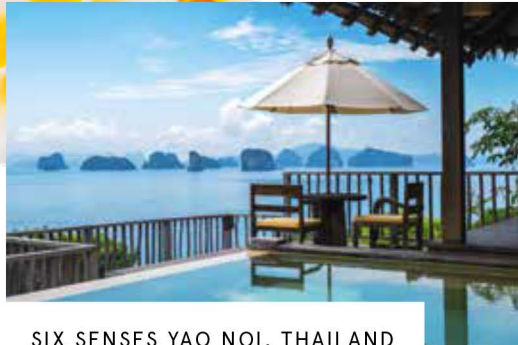

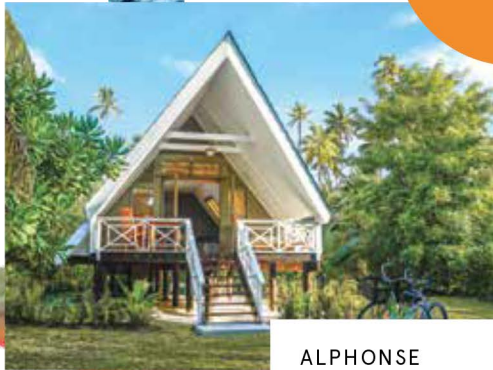
**SIX SENSES YAO NOI, THAILAND**

## ALPHONSE ISLAND, SEYCHELLES

*Situated at the heart of some of the world's finest fishing grounds, this back-to-nature retreat operates a strict catch-and-release policy and only allows 12 rods out at a time. ## THE BRANDO, FRENCH POLYNESIA
